

In 1907 Lundbreck was declared a Hamlet and pupils in the area attended school in a bunkhouse which served their needs until a proper schoolhouse was built in 1910. In 1932, two classrooms were established with Grades 1-5 and Grades 6-9.

In 1954 a Grade 12 class was established with the first graduating class of 3 students in 1955. In 1959, Livingstone School emerged boasting a gym and 7 new classrooms.





Livingstone School has a dedicated staff comprised of 17 Teachers and 12 Support Staff. The Livingstone Team is committed to providing students a personalized and engaged learning experience in a safe and caring environment.




Math Centers

Students planning to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program

Students plan to finish high school, and afterwards pursue a trade or apprenticeship program.

- 23% of students in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program; the Canada norm for these grades is 21%.
- 8% of the girls and 37% of the boys in this school planned to pursue a trade or apprenticeship program The Canada norm for girls is 19% and for boys is 24%.



 The Canada norm for girls is 72% and for boys is 58%.







