Encounters with Canada	<p>Every week Encounters with Canada (EWC) hosts over 120 dynamic young people who travel to the Terry Fox Canadian Youth Centre, forming a mini-Canada representation and taking part in an amazing bilingual adventure.</p> <p>The \$750 registration fee includes lodging, all meals, most planned activities and local transportation. Transportation costs to and from Ottawa are covered from anywhere in Canada! Some subsidies are available to reduce the registration fees.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • between 14 and 17 years of age • enrolled in an educational institution recognized by the Ministry of Education • A Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada • Interested in experiencing 1 of 12 career-themed weeks offered from mid-September to early December and from late January to early May.
Explore	<p>Explore is a five-week intensive French-immersion bursary program that is offered during the spring or summer for people with any skill level in French. Explore participants are awarded a \$2,200 bursary (taxable income) that covers tuition fees for the course, instructional materials, meals, and accommodation. You will discover another region of Canada while learning French in classes adapted to your language level. Canada World Youth	<p>Canada World Youth provides a variety of programs, in over 20 countries around the world, for youth between the ages of 15 and 35 looking to gain leadership experience through participation in community-driven development projects. The Global Learner program aims to promote global citizenship through the direct participation of youth in community-driven development projects.
